The committee has been talking for a while about increasing the amount we pay our hard-working accompanists, and it has been a hard decision to get right. We want to make sure we are looking after our accompanists, as well as attracting talent by providing reasonable pay. We also need to make sure we keep the books balanced as a community choir with many costs, including buying new sheet music regularly, insurance and hall hire fees, while keeping fees down! We have agreed on an immediate pay increase with more discussion to come at year's end.

Insurance

On the subject of costs, committee member Julie has gone through the unenviable task of checking our many insurance policies and making sure we're getting the best bang for our buck. After many months of searching and emailing, she's managed to save us over \$200 a year in fees, and made sure that our insurance was covering even more than it was before. This is a huge sum for a small choir – well done Julie!
